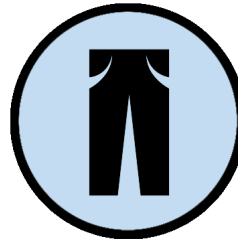


DRESS CODE



SHIRTS

Students are required to wear the IAHA uniform shirt. Only the top button is allowed unbuttoned and sleeves may not be rolled up. A white, navy, grey, or black shirt may be worn underneath; however, sleeves must not be longer than uniform shirt sleeves. Shirts must be worn tucked in, pressed, and appear freshly laundered. Be sure to wash shirts in cold water and do not bleach. We recommend a minimum of two shirts per student.



SLACKS

All students are required to wear non form-fitting black dress slacks that sit at the natural waist. Slacks should not be denim, low-rise, cargo, capri, or leggings style. Slacks with belt loops must be worn with a solid black leather belt, and must appear to be freshly laundered and pressed each day.



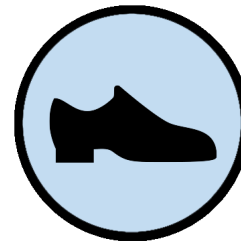
OUTERWEAR

Outerwear is expected to be a professional style. Outerwear and hats are not to be worn in the classrooms or hallways. A button-up, black cardigan (no fur, hoods, zipper, etc.) may be worn over your uniform shirt. IAHA name badge is required and may be worn with a lanyard.



ACCESSORIES AND GROOMING

Men and women should keep jewelry to a minimum. Hair must be clean cut and neatly styled. If you choose to color or highlight your hair, it must be a natural color. Beards and mustaches need to be trimmed and tidy. Fingernails need to be clean, trimmed and painted with a conservative color or no polish.



SOCKS AND SHOES

Professional looking, closed toe, **black** dress shoes or black leather work shoes (no boots/booties) must be worn with solid **black** dress socks or **black or nude** knee high nylons. Heels must not exceed 2 inches in height.



TATTOOS AND PIERCINGS

No visible tattoos are allowed. Any tattoos must be completely covered at all times. Females may wear **one** earring in each ear, no larger than a 10-cent piece with a conservative design and color(s). **No** other piercings, including gauges are allowed in visible areas. **black** socks are required to be worn at all times.
